Kimmage Environmental Group:

WHY do we need to help pollinators? Pollinators are important to farmers that grow pollinator dependent crops, to gardeners that want to grow their own fruits and vegetables and for the health of our environment. 78% of our wild plants require insect pollination. Without pollinators, these flowers would disappear, and our countryside would be a very different and less beautiful place.

All-Ireland Pollinator Plan 2015-2020. The All-Ireland Pollinator Plan is supported by over 80 governmental and non-governmental organisations who have pledged to deliver 81 actions to make Ireland, North & South, more pollinator friendly. It is a shared plan of action. Everyone, from farmers to councils, local communities, businesses, schools, faith communities, gardens and transport authorities have a role to play in the Pollinator Plan. What's Happening in Kimmage Manor Parish?

During the months of July & August many of the parish activities are taking a rest, this pause helps people to reenergise once again for September. Over the next 3/4 weeks the Newsletter will communicate what is going on in our parish, some of our activities need to be strengthened, hopefully through your presence that may be possible.

Partnership Pastoral Council: Two members of each of the Parish Pastoral Council's from the parishes of Kimmage, Greenhills, Templeogue (Pius X), Willington (St. Jude's), & Terenure together discuss how we as a unit can go forward as a faith Community. The resources of the five parishes will facilitate necessary decisions.

Deanery Council: more or less what has been mentioned concerning the Partnership Pastoral Council above, but this time with eleven neighbouring parishes.

Synodality, in a Catholic Church context, refers to the process of the Church journeying together, listening to one another, and discerning God's will through shared participation and responsibility. It's a way of being Church that emphasizes communion, participation, and mission, fostering a more collaborative and missionary approach. Essentially, it's about all members of the Church, not just the hierarchy, actively engaging in the life and mission of the Church. This is now the reality of the Parish Community in Kimmage Manor Parish, and is the basis of every decision we make.
